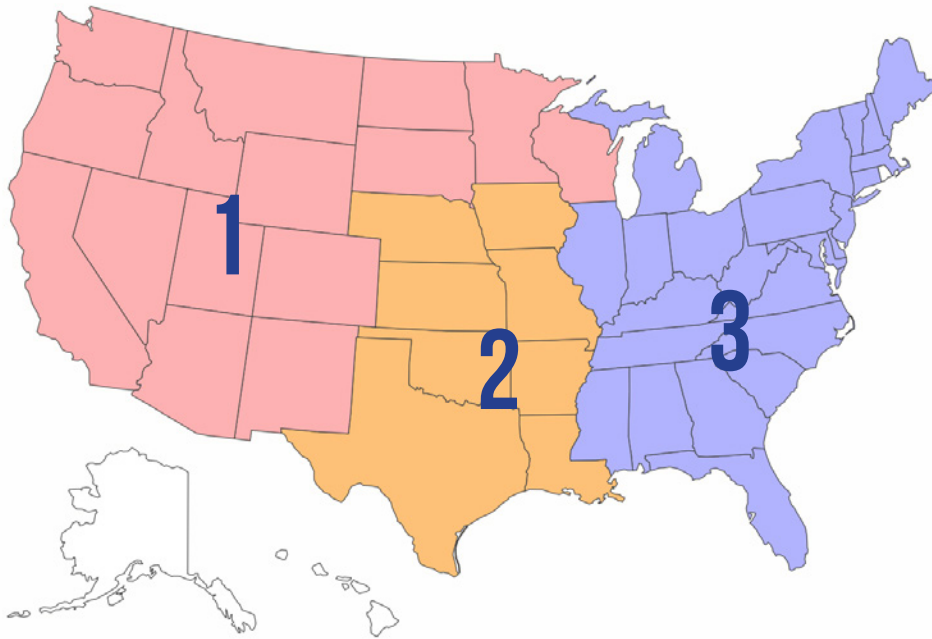

FDA GUIDANCE ENDING OVER-THE-COUNTER ANTIBIOTICS

Over-the-Counter Antibiotics will require Veterinary Oversight (Rx) beginning in June 2023 - Start Planning Now!

In June of 2021, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has announced that all medically important antimicrobials will move from over-the-counter (OTC) to prescription (Rx) only as of June 2023. The Center for Veterinary Medicine guidance for industry #263 (GFI 263) outlines the process. This means that the injectable, oral, intramammary, and topical forms of antibiotics will require a prescription from a licensed veterinarian.

What species are included?

This applies to all companion and farm animal species.

When do these new changes become effective?

Beginning in June 2023, or sooner, depending on when the manufacturer changes their labeling.

What does this mean to you and your livestock operation?

By June of 2023, all medically important antibiotics currently available at most feed or farm supply stores will now require veterinary oversight (written Rx) to be used in animals, even if the animals are not intended for food production. Examples of affected antibiotics include injectable penicillin and oxytetracycline. In addition, some retail suppliers who were able to sell these drugs/products in the past may no longer sell them after June of 2023.

This means in order to continue using medically important antimicrobials, you will need to establish a veterinarian-client-patient relationship (VCPR). Consult your veterinarian for more information.

What is a veterinarian-client-patient-relationship?

A veterinarian-client-patient-relationship (VCPR) is defined by the American Veterinary Medical Association as the basis for interaction among veterinarians, their clients, and their patients and is critical to the health of your animal(s). The practical explanation is that it is a formal relationship that you have with a veterinarian who serves as your primary contact for all veterinary services and is familiar with you, your livestock/animals, and your farm operation. This veterinarian is referred to as your Veterinarian of Record (VoR), and both the VoR and the client should sign a form to document this relationship.

How will this work?

That means producers will need to have veterinarian-client-patient-relationship (VCPR), in order to get affected antibiotics like penicillin, oxytetracycline and erythromycin.

This new guidance does not require producers to purchase antibiotics through their veterinarian. Producers can use online pharmacies as long as they have a prescription.

The guidance does not affect antiparasitic drugs.

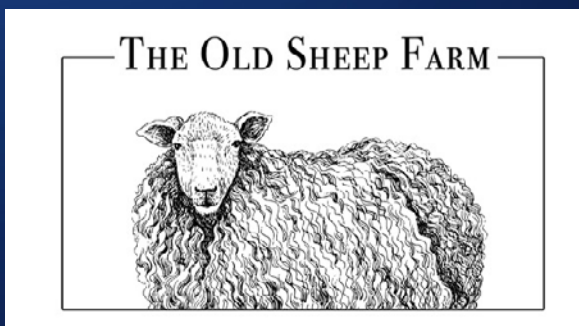

MONTADALE FAMILY HISTORY

Clayman Montadales & Lohr Montadales

Susan Proctor asked if we could share some of the Montadale history for our families. Now, I have to really work on getting it all pulled together.

Sandy's dad, Elwood Lohr, started with Montadales sometime in the late 50's or early 60's and I have no recollection of where he got the original ewes from. He was a driving force in keeping the popularity of the breed going in Ohio. At State Fair, he was always standing in the tack pen talking to complete strangers, going up and down the main aisle talking about the good qualities of the Montadales and why they should try a ram on their flock or get a few ewes to work with. He had a good gift of communication and was an excellent salesman.

I have no idea how many sheep he sold at state fair and all the other shows that they went to in north central Ohio.

The Lohr family was always working to promote the breed. Elwood, Arlene, Sandy, Jackie and Linda, would work really hard to get 6 head ready for each of the 5 or 6 classes at state fair Junior show. The open show was

a little different, the numbers would pare down to the best 8-10 head.

It was always a treat to watch five people trim on one sheep at the same time and they managed to make them look really good for how we did it back then. We sheared the backs down to make them look wider, also we had a good 3 plus inches of wool on the sides. Thicker sheep is what you wanted at that time in the mid 60's.

There were a lot of Montadale breeders in Ohio at that time; Dave Sutton, Stanley Algrie, the Cloyd Hulver Family, the Terrill boys, Russ Johnson and a lot more that I don't remember. We always seemed to pull a lot of breeders from Illinois for the show. Keith and Helen Crome, the Dunseth Bros. (Max, Jay), Jim and Jeff Handy, Dan Ryan, were just a few of the breeders. The show would be 150-200 head and more. The yearling ewe class would have 60 plus (no splitting classes in those days) and there were a lot of good ones in there. It was one big family. They ate together, played cards and had a good time. State fair lasted for 8-10 days.

It was in 1968 that Elwood's oldest daughter caught my eye and I tried my best to get her attention. Took a couple of years, but I was finally successful to get her to come around. That is when things took off.

Sandy was selected as the first National Montadale Queen in 1969. She was going to college and working a summer job in 1970. The main crew left from Nevada and headed to Springfield. We left a day later to head out to the National. That was my first trip to Springfield and we have only missed 3 times since then.

What has always amazed me is the number of sheep that were at the shows in the 70's and 80's. Elwood did a good job of selecting and breeding good ones and I tried my best to make them look good for the shows. We had success along the way.

One highlight that we will always remember was in 1977 Elwood had a good yearling ewe. She was first in class and Reserve Champion ewe. We couldn't get around a fall ewe lamb that the Dunseth Bros. had for the Champion ewe. The ewe was named KADAIJO (middle names or parts of names for the three girls). Bob Nelson was the winning bidder

and she sold for a thousand dollars, the first Montadale ewe to bring a thousand dollars.

Quick side note is Bob Nelson was the first person I watched use a yard stick to measure sheep at a sale, he wanted to make sure he got the biggest one in the barn.

The National Show and Sale in Springfield was the highlight for all Montadale breeders from across the country.

Many of us stayed downstairs in the junior barn, we ate together, and had great fellowship in those years; fond memories to be remembered by those of us who were there.

In 1979 we lost our driving force of the family Arlene to cancer: she was as much of a promotor of the breed as Elwood. Those were the days we showed at a lot of shows in the Midwest.

I remember the first NAILE in 1974, I believe that is correct, also had the Chicago International the same year. The following year was the last for Chicago and the NAILE still lives on.

Now on to more current things. Michael was born in 1978. So, our family started taking on a new look. We were still in Ohio running two breeds, Columbias for Sandy while Elwood and I kept the Montadale flock going. Michelle came into the world in 1981 and later that year, I changed careers, moving everyone to Kansas. We had no chores for 3 years and no sheep.

Elwood sent two yearling ewes out for us to start a flock for the kids.

We also purchased a couple ewe lambs from Kathrine Tyler. We were fortunate that Wes Flory was close so we could borrow a ram to breed with. We can trace a lot of the ewes we have back to the original two ewes.

The flock carried the name of M & M Montadales for several years and these are probably the most important years.

Michael and Michelle worked with the sheep during the 4-H and FFA years and on into college. The learning experiences those two got while growing up with the responsibilities of caring for the sheep definitely will last their lifetimes.

Learning to handle the heart breaks when the best one broke her leg, or the favorite ewe lamb got sick, or the late nights at lambing time.

When Hubba Bubba passed, she was only 10 and should have made for a couple more years for sure; she was one of the two original ewes that Elwood gave to the kids.

Livestock selection, deciding which ones are the best to keep. Balancing the checkbook, do we have enough money to buy feed? Making decisions that affect the future of what we do. We have managed to sneak in a good show ewe or two along the way. The ewe, Enough Said, was one of those. Supreme Champion at the American Royal, Champion in the Junior show in Louisville.

Learning to breed a good productive sheep as well as sheep that looks good in the show ring is somewhat difficult as the two don't always

match up. During the growing up years for the kid's we did manage to get some good rams that worked and sired the kind we liked.

A Crome ram we called Too Grand, a George Murdock ram that put a lot of milking ability into the brood ewe flock. Also a Phil and Cindy Hoffman ram that was way more massive than most people would have picked. We can still find these rams in our pedigrees today.



Can't leave out the Hughy Salfner ram, what an impact he has had in our flock as wells as for others. We recognized early on that the breed was losing a lot of testicle size. So we regrouped and made sure we corrected that problem at home. Made a lot of difference later on within the

ewe flock.

We have been fortunate to have good grass pastures to run the ewes on over the years. It makes for a selection process that most people don't consider. They have to be able to graze and convert that grass back into body flesh as well as having structure to get around on.

Worming is done on an individual basis, the one that needs wormed get wormed the others are left alone. We haven't wormed all of the ewes at one time for several years. DNA codon testing is the first selection process here if you not RR you're for sale, if your nose isn't black or very dark, and your hooves are not black you're for sale. Breed character is still very important, you have to look like a Montadale to be here.

The kids and grandkids still are involved. Sedalia is one time during the year that we try to get together.

Working on the sheep has made us a team effort that many people don't always have.

We have managed to produce a couple of National Champion ewes since the sale has moved to Sedalia and a couple of good rams. Need to mention our Extended family that has added to our Montadale family: Ted and Jansyn Van Horn (father and daughter). They have 10-15 ewes that live here at our place and they are a great asset to our operation.

At the current time we have 90 brood ewes, 24 replacement ewes, 4 mature rams and 4 ram lambs. With the drought we have been in it's going to be hard to get through the winter. Feed supplies are short but we think we have enough to make it.

Do we like Montadales? You bet we do! We wouldn't have kept them 50 years if we didn't.

Our lives have revolved around the sheep industry and it's been a great ride. Looking forward to another 50 years but we may have to cut that back to 20 years.

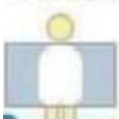

THE HISTORY OF MONTADALES



The history of the Montadale breed of sheep dates back nearly half a century.

Much of the credit for the development of the Montadale goes to E.H. Mattingly, a well-known commercial lamb buyer who has obsessed with the idea of producing the “ideal sheep.” Early in his youth, Mattingly had been advised that if he could bring together the qualities of the big western white face sheep and the popular mutton characteristics of midwestern sheep, he would be well on his way.

It was some time before Mattingly was able to begin his project, but in 1932 he drove to Kalispell, Montana where he purchased the first Columbia ram to go east of the Mississippi River. This ram was crossed on purebred Cheviot ewes and the resulting lamb crop provided sufficient proof that his mission was on target.

In order to find the most profitable combination, the sire and dam of these two parent breeds were reversed. These two crosses continued for several years with tests being made as to the growth and development of the lambs, the number of lambs per ewe, weights of the lamb and fleece weight and grade.

The Columbia ewe and the Cheviot ram were then adopted as the foundation for the Montadale breed and after nine years of selective culling and linebreeding, a sheep was developed that met the desired standard.

For fifteen years, many of these Montadale lambs were carcass tested for characteristics which are now the standard in the industry but which at that time were yet to become widely accepted as the idea. Mattingly definitely had an eye to the future in his progressive views on wool clip, growth rate, carcass quality and lambing percentage.

The early results gained the attention of sheep producers across the land as Montadales made their mark in lambing contests, ram testing experiments and fat stock shows.

In 1945, the Montadale Sheep Breeders Association was founded with five charter members. E.H. Mattingly became the first executive secretary and Anne Gregory the secretary-treasurer. It was Ann Gregory who served the association for 30 years, who founded the registry system of the breed.

Headquartered in Indianapolis, Indiana, the breed now has active producers in every corner of the country. Montadales have proven themselves in the cold upper reaches of New England, in the hot climate of the South, on the farms of the midwest, on the ranges of Great Plains and in the rainy climate of the Farm West.



SKIRTING A FLEECE

The process of going through a fleece and removing all the unusable bits and pieces.

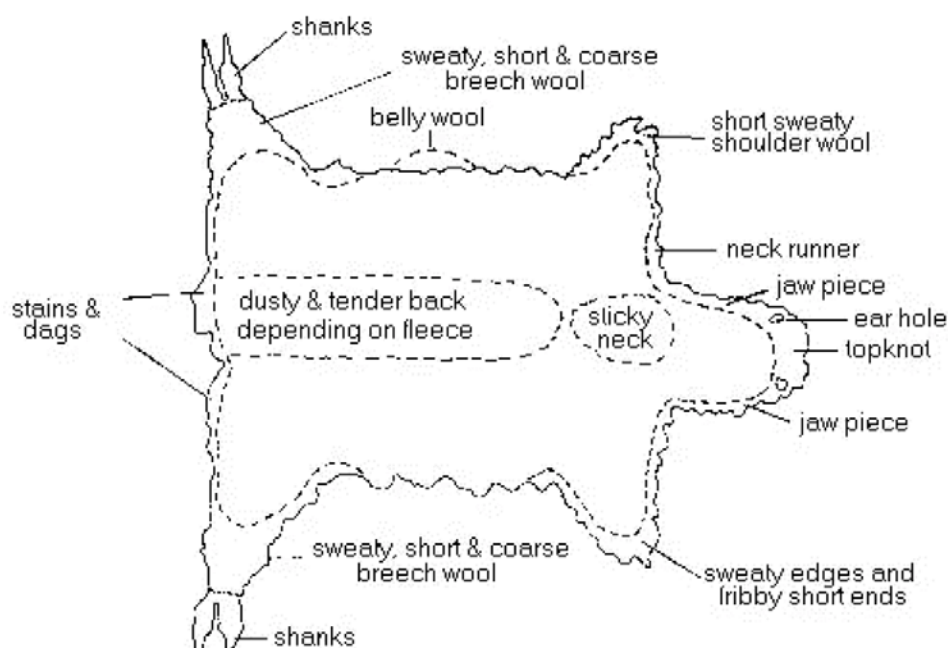
There is nothing more impressive in the sheep world than a sparkling white, close sheared Montadale gliding over the tanbark of the show ring. The long, elegant necks, long straight topline with the clean open faces and legs are an inspiration to behold. This same clear white color, length of body and lofty spring to the fleece is a hidden secret that is slowly being revealed in the Montadale world. Crafts people who spin their own yarns, knit, crochet, needle punch tapestries and rugs or weave their own cloth and wearable articles as well as the people who create everything from ornaments to paintings with needle felted wools, are developing an appreciation for the diversity and durability found in the Montadale wool. While the breed has not been bred for lock consistency like the Columbia or the Merino, the very inconsistency of the fleece allows for several projects to be created from one fleece. If you are looking at diversifying your agricultural venues and want to make the most of raising sheep, you should learn to skirt and clean a full fleece to be sold at market.

- First, you need to know the anatomy of your fleece! Within one fleece, you will find different grades or quality of wool, which are used for different purposes. The simple diagram labels the different parts of your

fleece. Once you are familiar with what you are looking at, begin sorting through each fleece, carefully removing all of the undesirable wool.

- Use a skirting table to sort through your fleeces. A table with an open mesh works best, as it allows short cuts of wool and manure tags to fall through. I built my own skirting table, legs and all, using 4" pvc pipe and deer netting. The netting is soft, has small ½ inch holes short cuts, dirt, and trash to fall through. An added benefit is that it is light weight, and easy to move when necessary. You can use chicken wire or a screen that has a wide enough spacing to allow debris to fall through. If you use wire, I would suggest using a coated wire that won't be as quick to snag in your wool. Many of you may already have skirting tables, whether hand made or purchased if you are selling wool to the local wool pool.

- Remove the belly and leg wool first. I remove this right on the shearing floor. As soon as the last lock of wool falls from the shearer's blades, I remove the belly and leg wool from the shearing floor. It goes in the "discard" bag. My shearer will shear this first and scoot it in my direction to collect it up while she finishes shearing. This makes great mulch because a lot

of manure and other organic material can be found in the leg, belly and crutch wools. It is also great to hold moisture in the ground as well as giving young plant roots a good place to start. There can also be a lot of kemp in these areas on the Montadale which is a definite no-no in the fiber world. Kemp will not take dye and it is very scratching causing irritation to skin.

- Remove all breech wool in the leg area. The breech wool is more coarse than the rest of the fleece. The picture below shows breech wool and beautiful locks of wool from the same sheep. I use breech wool for rug yarn, needle felting and dryer balls.
- Remove all clumps of manure or manure tags. Remove vegetation matter like hay and wood shavings.
- Shake the fleece to let any short cuts of wool and other debris fall to the ground. Some shepherds will scoop up the short cuts and use them in felting projects, mulch, and stuffed pet beds.
- Remove any heavily discolored wool or brittle wool, and wool heavily contaminated with hay. Brittle wool will have breaks in it and won't hold up to the tension of most of the crafts wool is used for. The more vegetable matter(vm) found in the wool at the mill the more it will cost to have it processed. Heavy contaminants such as twigs, cockleburs, and wood shavings can cause damage to the carders and combs used in processing. This does not make you a new friend at the mill! Once you have the fleece skirted, fold the head and tail into the middle of the back, keeping the cut ends on the outside. Then roll the fleece from one side to the other, creating a lovely display of your fleece that will show off the color, staple length, and crimp of the fiber to any who stop to look.

Yes, it takes more effort to prepare a fleece to sell on its own merits rather than in a cwt of wool to the wool pools. You want to avoid creating shorts during shearing. These affect the consistency of the staple length of the lock and can affect the ease of spinning your wool. However, with a little time and attention, you will quickly find people scrambling to purchase your Montadale fleeces year after year at a much better price than you are going to get from the wool pools.

MONTADALE SHEEP BREEDERS ASSOCIATION EWE LAMB FUTURITY

General Description and Rules: The futurity is designed to allow junior members an opportunity to compete with breeder nominated ewe lambs purchased at designated public sales or with ewe lambs they have raised themselves.

Nominated ewe lambs will be announced as such prior to their sale. The nomination fees are paid by the breeder or Jr Member entering a self-raised ewe lamb. The fees encompass the pool of funds available for premiums payable to futurity winners. Points for the futurity are accumulated through exhibiting the nominated ewe lambs at various shows with placings from first through tenth receiving a premium.

- Nominated ewe lambs are futurity eligible if:
 - purchased at recognized sale where Montadales are sold by auction
 - bred and owned by the junior nominator (must own the dam). The breeder name on the registration papers must match the junior owner/nominator's name.
 - purchased "off the farm" from a Montadale breeder in good standing with the Association
- To be eligible for the futurity, ewe lamb must be nominated and designated by a consignor or Jr. Member and a \$20 fee must be paid to the Montadale Sheep Breeders Association.
 - Nominated Ewe lambs purchased off a farm or Jr. member bred/owned must be nominated by June 1

Exhibitor Rules:

- All persons who meet the requirements for eligibility to show in the Junior Show at the North American International Livestock Exposition (NAILE) shall be eligible to participate in the futurity.
- Person must have an up-to-date current membership in the Montadale Sheep Breeders Junior Association.
- ***All persons desiring to participate in the futurity shall fully complete a Futurity Entrant form and return it to the Montadale Sheep Breeders Association. No futurity points will accumulate until after the form is received by MSBA.***
- All ewe lambs must be nominated and transferred into the name of the individual exhibitor only. Nominated ewe lambs must remain registered in the name of the individual exhibitor at least through the conclusion of the 2022 Junior Show at the NAILE.
- Ewe lambs and points earned in the futurity are not transferable to any other person, other than the original owner, nor are the points transferable from one animal to another.
- Exhibitors may accumulate points on more than one animal but only one premium will be awarded to an exhibitor. This will be for the exhibitor's ewe lamb that has accumulated the most points. Points Scoring:
Placing 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10+ # of Points 10 9 8 7 6 5 4 3 2 1
- *In order for points to be earned, entrants must make certain that the Futurity Point Record form is fully completed and forwarded to the Montadale Sheep Breeders Association, 47289 Highway 324, Brookings, SD 57006 within **21 days of the date of show** for which the points are being earned. The form must be signed by the superintendent of the appropriate show. If the form is not completed and returned properly, no points will accumulate for that show.*

- Futurity ewe lambs may earn futurity points from either the open division or junior division of any individual show but not both. However, at the NAILE, only junior show placings will be counted toward points totals.
- Point accumulation will begin at any show after April 1, of the designated year and end at conclusion of the Keith Crome National Junior Show at NAILE. In addition, effective 2015, points can be accumulated at the Jim & Dorothy Handy Junior Show in conjunction with the National Show & Sale.
- Ewe lambs may compete at an unlimited number of shows but winner must have accrued points from at least one Double Point Show.
- Double Point Shows: State Fair Open show, State Fair Junior/4H/FFA show, All-American Junior Show, KILE Open or Junior show, Keith Crome NAILE Junior Show Awards & Premiums
- Futurity winners will be announced following the NAILE Junior Show. Premiums will be mailed to the winners by MSBA following NAILE.
- There will be a National Montadale Futurity winner and placings through not more than tenth (10th) place based upon the highest total points as described above compared to total points for all other futurity entrants.
- Premiums shall be paid from a pool consisting of consignor nomination fees and will be allocated accordingly based on number of participants. Valbazen Suspension (11.36 % or 113.6 mg/ml): 7.5 mg/kg orally; approved in sheep with meat withdrawal time of 7 days. Do NOT use in pregnant ewes in the first trimester of pregnancy.

Safe-Guard/ Panacur Suspension (10% or 100 mg/ml): Note that SafeGuard is not approved for use in sheep. Sheep dose is 5 mg/kg orally; meat withdrawal time of 6 days.

Ivomec Drench for Sheep (0.08% or 0.8 mg/ml): 0.2 mg/kg orally; approved in sheep with meat withdrawal time of 11 days. Protect from light.

Prohibit Soluble Drench Powder (Sheep): (Note that this drug is also sold as Levasol and Tramsiol) 8 mg/kg ORAL dose. Approved for use in sheep with meat withdrawal of 3 days. Solution prepared by dissolving a 52 gram packet in 1 quart (943 ml) of water. This yields a solution with 49.6 mg/ml. Always make sure to follow directions on packet when preparing.

If dosing lambs, it is safer to dilute further (1 packet in 2 quarts of water), and then administer twice the amount listed on the chart. The larger volume administered will provide a wider margin for safety if there are small errors in dosing.
